The SeaPort-e contract combines the benefits of a truly paperless, electronic procurement system with contracting best practices. This indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity (IDIQ) multiple-award contract (MAC) allows the Virtual SYSCOM, as well as Commander, Naval Installations, and the US Marine Corps to acquire a wide range of engineering, technical, and programmatic services and solutions. SeaPort-e furthers the Navy's Seapower 21 objective to increase efficiency and allows for tailoring services according to the needs of geographically dispersed organizations with significantly diverse product area requirements and missions

Benefits and Features of SeaPort-e Include:

- Authorized users include all warranted contracting officers of Naval Sea Systems Command (NAVSEA), Naval Air Systems Command (NAVAIR), Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command (SPAWAR), Naval Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP), Military Sealift Command, Strategic Systems Program (SSP), Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC), Office of Naval Research, Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA) and the US Marine Corps. SeaPort-e is the mandatory contract vehicle for the Virtual SYSCOM for engineering, program management, and financial management services.
- Both Firm Fixed Price and Cost Reimbursable task orders are permitted. Profit on CPFF contracts is contractually constrained, and the maximum "pass-through" on subcontractors is 8 percent.
- There is NO FEE to authorized users.
- Prime contract holders may add an unlimited number of small or large business partners to their teams.
- There are currently more than 1,600 prime contractors, and there is a once-a-year rolling admission period to award new prime contracts.
- Procurement is competitive – All prime contract holders have a fair opportunity to compete (FOTC). Task order solicitations may be set aside for small businesses, and individual task orders may include subcontracting goals.
- The contract covers 22 functional areas and 6 geographic zones. The zone system preserves the local vendor base - companies must have an established presence in a zone to bid.

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How to Use SeaPort-e:

The SeaPort-e procurement process is entirely electronic — from RFP submission to delivery of the awarded task order to the successful bidder. To learn more, please visit the SeaPort-e portal at <http://www.seaport.navy.mil/index.html>. Summary features of the process include:

- Task order solicitations, modifications, and awards are released through the SeaPort-e portal. Nswc Dahlgren is the Seaport-e Contracting Office, however, each activity will release its own RFPs.
- All proposals are submitted electronically through the portal.
- Task order award and execution is decentralized and performed by the ordering activity's contracting shop.
- Customers who are not part of the Virtual SYSCOM can use SeaPort-e by working with an authorized contracting office.
